



GLRSA COVID POSITIVE IDENTIFICATION GUIDE

When a GLRSA player, coach, referee, or volunteer is showing symptoms, and thinks they may have contracted the virus, the individual should seek to be tested and follow up with their local or state health department.

Players with symptoms or having been exposed to anyone with the virus should not participate in team activities until they receive a negative test result.

Any GLRSA individual that tests positive, or has been in contact with a person that tests positive, must not participate in GLRSA activities. The individual (or parent) must inform GLRSA of the positive test at GLRSACovidreporting@gmail.com. That player, coach, referee, or volunteer and all those that have been in contact with them should self-quarantine according to CDC and local health guidelines.

When a GLRSA player, coach, referee, or volunteer has tested positive and the case is confirmed by local health officials, all GLRSA players, families, coaches, referees, and volunteers will be notified that a GLRSA individual has tested positive. GLRSA will not identify the individual, but rather leave that communication to local health officials.

All GLRSA players, coaches, referees, and/or volunteers should follow their local or state guidelines for contact tracing and quarantine requirements.

GLRSA, in cooperation with their local health department, will clean and sanitize the necessary facilities. GLRSA will work with local health officials to determine next steps for reopening and play.
